This new public square offers a feeling of peace and quiet in Eindhoven's hectic city center. A pergola overgrown by wisteria and roses offers passersby a glimpse into the tranquil, green atmosphere. Allowing residents a place to escape the intensity of urban life, the square acts as an intimate enclave with its own distinctive identity. Elongated Corten steel planters create a rhythmic striped pattern across the plaza, resulting in alternating open and closed spaces. These stripes vary in length, width, and height to integrate wooden benches and bicycle stands.
